

Distribution Box Coding Rules



Overview

The codes entered in Box 7 of Form 1099-R indicate the type of distribution received and its taxability. You can get the General Instructions for Certain Information Returns at IRS. We added a new code "Y" to the list of codes for box 7 to identify a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). A wrong code can trigger unexpected tax bills, early. Maybe it's 1, 7, G, or a combination like 7B. That's why so many taxpayers get stuck on the same question.

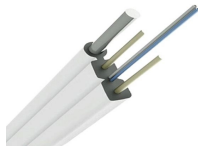
