In short, the terminal box is the last structured node of the Fiber Optic System before service touches the subscriber. A typical PON topology (GPON, XGS-PON, or 25G PON) flows OLT → fiber distribution hub → passive splitters → distribution/drop fibers → premises. Typical FTTH. It is the junction point between the distribution fiber cables and the drop cables that. In modern FTTH (Fiber to the Home) and optical communication networks, three types of fiber distribution products are widely used: Splitter Distribution Box, ODF (Optical Distribution Frame), and Fiber Terminal Box. It provides a secure and organized point for fiber cabling, splicing, splitting, and distribution, while ensuring reliable protection and easy management for long-term.

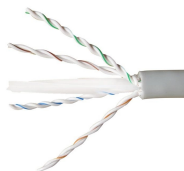

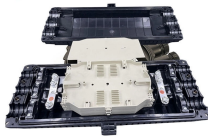

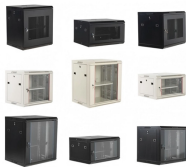
